

## Director Mueller to Speak...

**"Ladies & Gentlemen, Start Your Engines!!!"**

This should be the best-attended NAFUSA Conference in the history of the organization. But alas, we are not receiving your reservations. The cut off date with the J.W. Marriott Hotel is August 15, 2002. That is right around the corner. I once again, include in this newsletter our schedule of events and a conference registration form. Please do yourself a favor and get this business taken care of. It does me a favor also.

Robert Mueller, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation has graciously accepted our invitation to address this year's conference. We are proud and honored. Our program is second to none! Director Mueller has served in a number of positions in the United States Department of Justice.

From 1976 to 1988, Mr. Mueller held various positions as a prosecutor and supervisor, first in the office of the United States Attorney for the Northern District of California in San Francisco, and beginning in 1982 in the office of the United States Attorney for the District of Massachusetts in Boston.

From 1986 to 1990 Mr. Mueller served in the Department of Justice as an assistant to Attorney General Richard L Thornburgh. Then in August 1990, he was the Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Criminal Division of the United States Department of Justice. During his tenure, he supervised, among other matters, the Noriega and Gotti prosecutions, the Pan Am 103 Investigation, and the development of the Department's policies on corporate sentencing guidelines, computer crime investigations, and health care and money laundering prosecutions.

He was the United States Attorney for the Northern District of California in August 1998 until August 2001, although he served as the Acting Deputy Attorney General of the United States Department of Justice from January to May 2001.

Director Mueller also served as an officer in the United States Marine Corps for three years, including one year in the Third Marine Division, Vietnam. He is the recipient of the Bronze Star and has received two Navy Commendation Medals, the Purple Heart and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry. He received his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Virginia School of Law in 1973.

Mr. Mueller was confirmed as Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation by the United States Senate on August 2, 2001, and took the oath of office on September 4, 2001.

We have some pretty important people joining us in Washington, besides his Honor, The Chief Justice and Director Mueller, Asa Hutchinson – the Director of the Drug Enforcement Agency (D.E.A.) is a "will show". Assistant Attorney General Jay S. Bybee, Office of Legal Counsel, will be with us.

## Map of Washington, D.C.

One hundred years ago, the Mall had trains running through it and a cattle depot on the present location of the Washington Monument. On recommendations by Congress at the turn of the century, L'Enfant's 'vast esplanade' was restored. Today, this beautiful one and three quarter mile greenway is anchored on one end by the Capitol and on the other by the Lincoln Memorial, and offers a multitude of things to do and see. Explore 'The Nation's Attic' in the many museums of the Smithsonian; visit the Jefferson Memorial for a moment of tranquility; and view the glorious Tidal Basin with the 600 cherry trees that surround it.

Take a ride to the top of the Washington Monument to see the entire expanse of the Capital. Just off the Mall, cross the Ellipse to the White House — the 54-room 160,000-sq-ft home and office of the President. Formerly called the 'Executive Mansion', it was renamed after it was burned by the British during the War of 1812, and the charred sandstone exterior was painted white. Although he never lived there, George Washington chose the site of the White House, just one mile west of Capitol Hill and with a view of the Potomac. The Mall is truly the political and cultural heart of America.
